
MENTAL HEALTH: Continuum of Care

RESTORING YOUTHS' MENTAL HEALTH

Vista Maria's Mental Health Programs help adolescents successfully manage psychiatric conditions so they may heal, transform and move into less-restrictive environments

Youths admitted to the Mental Health Programs must be between the ages of 11 and 17. General symptoms for admission include, but are not limited to:

- Suicidal ideations and attempts
- Major depressive disorder
- Post-traumatic stress disorder
- Adjustment reaction with mood disturbance
- Bi-Polar disorder
- · Anxiety disorder
- · Impulse control disorder
- Self-injurious behaviors

Vista Maria is a place for youth and their families to realize a life beyond trauma and ignite a life of possibility. We are fearless in our commitment to keep them safe, to make them strong and our courageous compassion finds new ways to bring wholeness and possibility to those who need it most.

Our clients receive an individualized treatment plan that meets their special needs, including:

- Individual, group and family therapy
- Recreational and art therapy
- Regular sessions with a child/ adolescent psychiatrist

- Daily contact, care and coordination of each youth's health needs

- Psychological assessment and testing

Three Levels of Care Including:

UNITY Intensive care for acute psychiatric stabilization.

SPECIAL CARE UNIT A structured program to support or help girls with episodic emotional and/or psychiatric instability.

BRIDGES An open program that focuses on family and community reintegration while continuing to provide psychiatric services.
